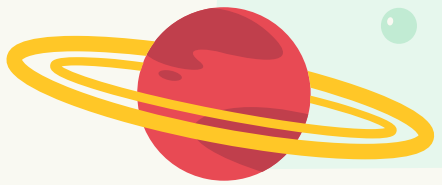

Here you can see our teachers using the classroom during the division-wide PD activities around math manipulatives.






# AMAZING DUCK RACE

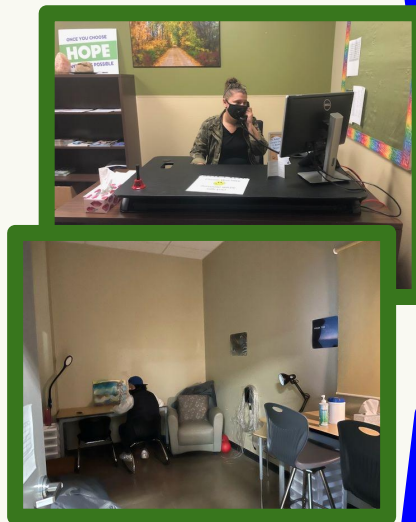

# JAWS Good News Items for September: Mental Health and Stress Reduction

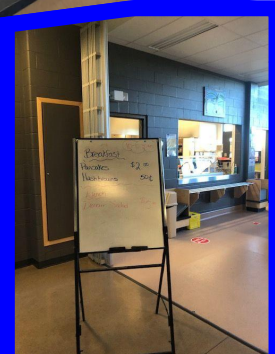
COVID-19 has forced us to initiate some changes at JAWS over the last school year that we feel have had positive consequences for the school that we chose to keep this year. We are choosing to highlight a couple of these for you:



★  
**Lockers:** We have decreased the need for lockers by focusing on continued development of executive functioning for students. We have also worked to globally organize students within the classrooms. This helps with less congestion in hallways, students on time for class and fully prepared.



**Triage and MH Mini-Breaks:** Students can't learn unless they are regulated and ready. We have several designated break-out spaces and reset centers available for students to work or reset, using their proven effective strategies.



JAWS operates mainly on a **quarterly system**, meaning that students take 2 classes per day. Each class is nearly 3 hours long and runs for 10 weeks. There are many positive outcomes of this system but we also need to be creative when considering mental health and wellness of students so we have implemented strategies such as:

- staggering our breaks, giving them on an as needed basis throughout classes,
- ensuring the cafeteria is open for students, providing healthy options.
- teachers incorporate regular movement breaks within the classroom like Silent Ball as pictured here (Mel Harpe and her English 30-2 class taking a break after an assessment). One of the major benefits is students only study one, maximum 2 core classes per term meaning exam time has become less stressful.
