Where is the Arctic region located?

The Arctic region is located in Nunavut and the northwest territories for animals and the people who live there.

What are three natural resources found in this region?

The main regions in the Arctic are linked to oil and gas exploitation from the Beaufort Sea North Slope, Alaska and Mackenzie Delta, Canada. Canada's Arctic is one of Earth's last frontiers for natural resource development. As a result mining and oil and gas development will be a key economic development instrument. The region is rich in diamonds, gold, oil and gas, base metals iron ore and zinc.


How was the arctic region impacted the identity of Canada?
