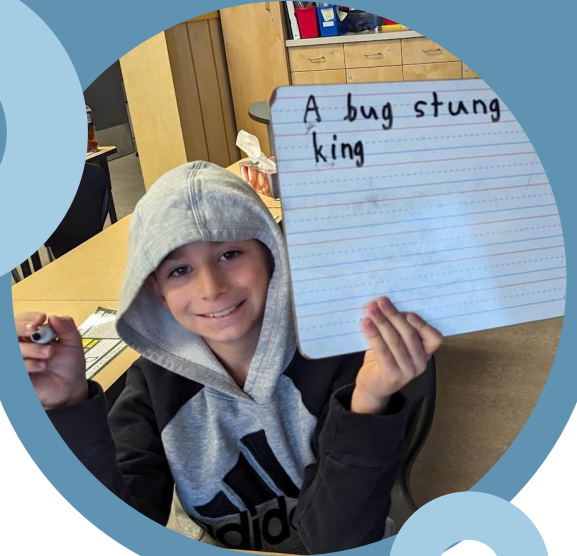


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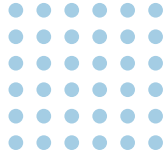

Leadership Group is on a roll, achieving remarkable feats and making waves in their accomplishments!



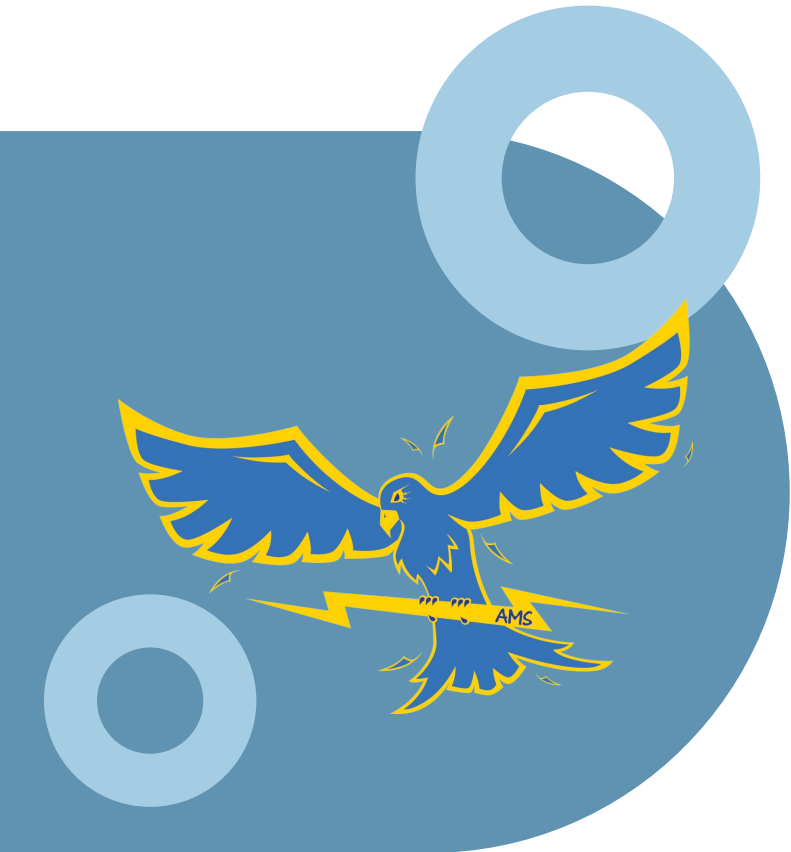
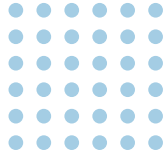


ASAA's leadership group joined our administrative team to discuss the school's 3 year plan. They enjoyed a pizza lunch and provided feedback/suggestions on school goals.

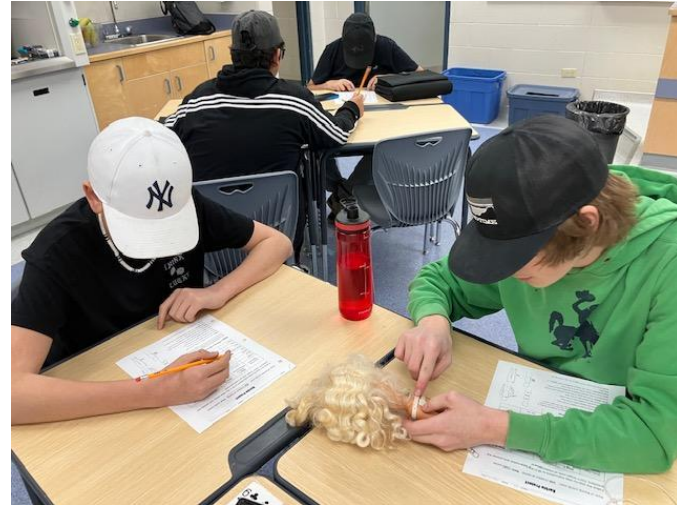
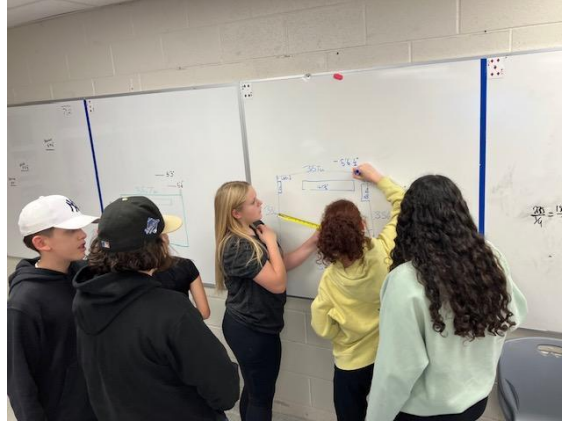
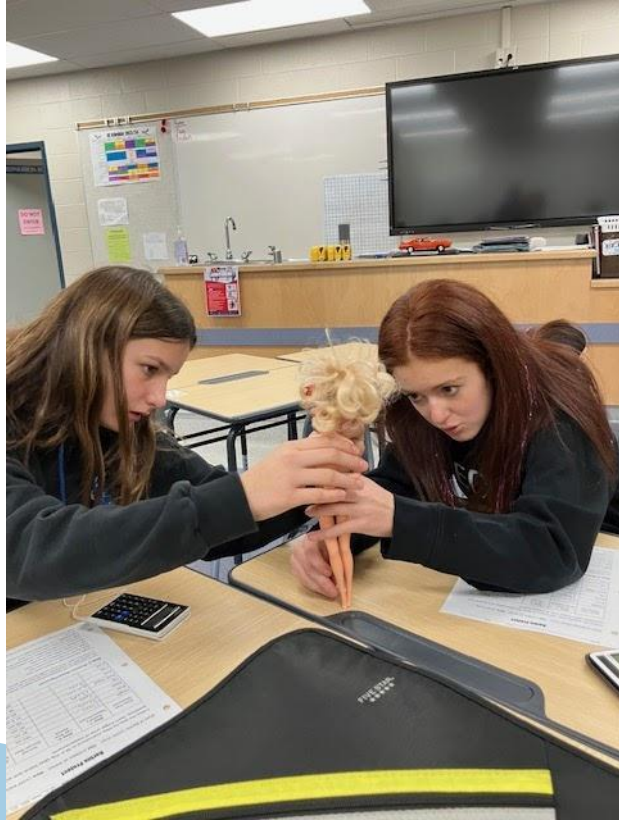
Student Achievement with Thinking Classrooms

- On 8 of 9 Diploma exam subjects CLHS outperformed the Province
- Very high results compared to the province in terms of the percentage of teachers, parents and students satisfied with the overall quality of basic education.
- The CLHS drop-out rate is below the provincial dropout rate.
- The 3 yr high school completion rate for FNMI students is low but the 5 year completion rate is very high at 92%

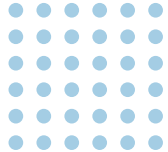


A highlight of Metis week was the Staff vs. Student Relay Race.

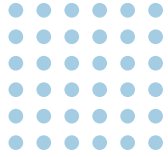
This week we have been:

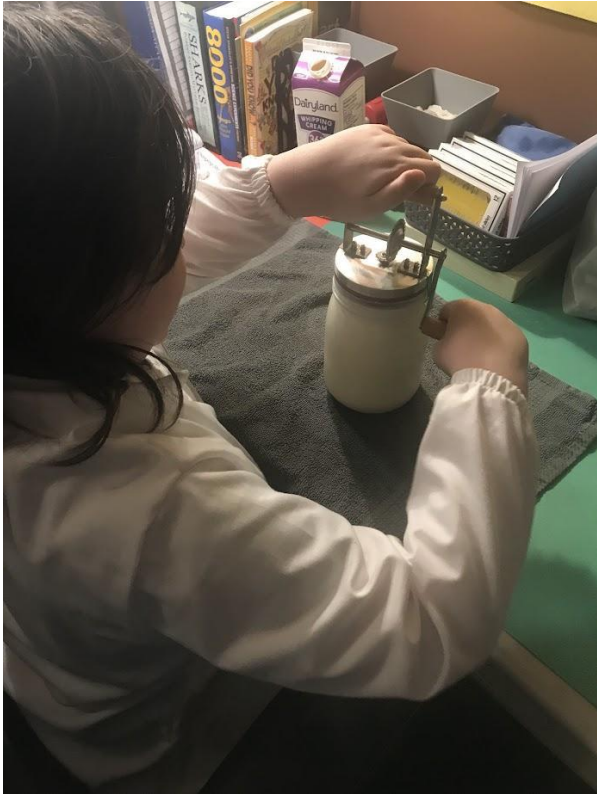

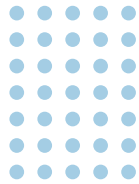

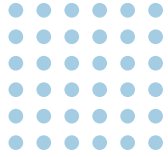




Nelson Heights is administering a Math Basic Skills Assessment in November and again in Early May. The purpose of this assessment is to determine where students are at with their Math Basic skills and to see if they improve over the course of the 23-24 school year.

The impetus for this is that the Gr.6 Math Provincial Achievement Test has changed. Students used to be able to use a multiplication chart and a calculator on Part B of the PAT. Starting in the 23-24 school year they NO LONGER can use a multiplication chart or a calculator. All calculations must be done using the basic facts they know and understand from memory.
