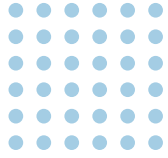

These beautiful tents will help protect our students from all weather conditions during sport meets and outdoor activities!





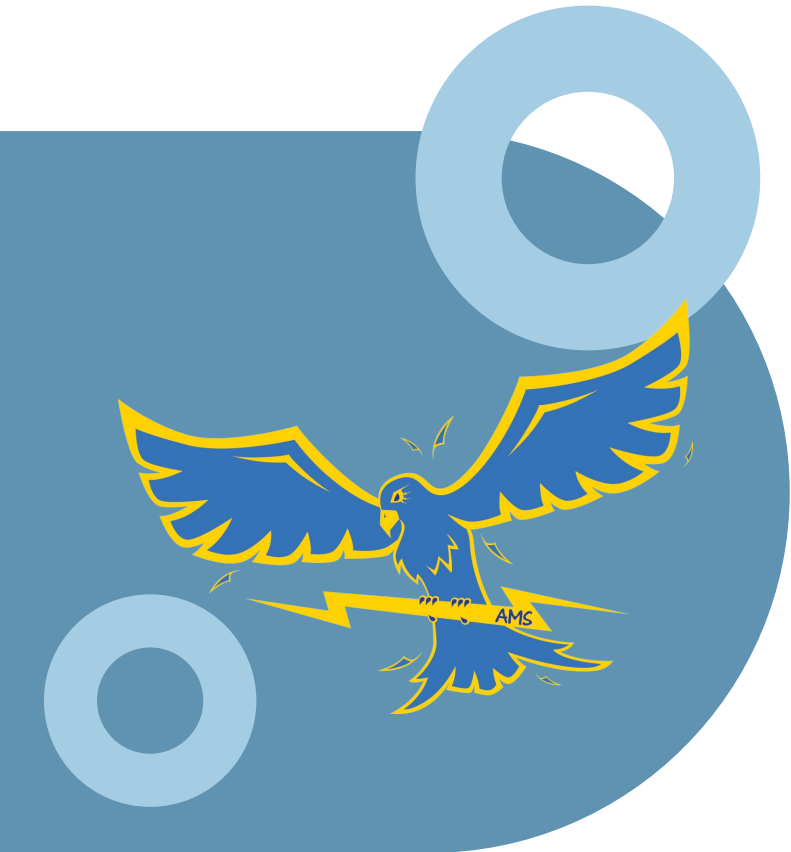
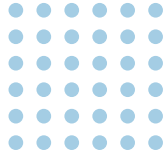

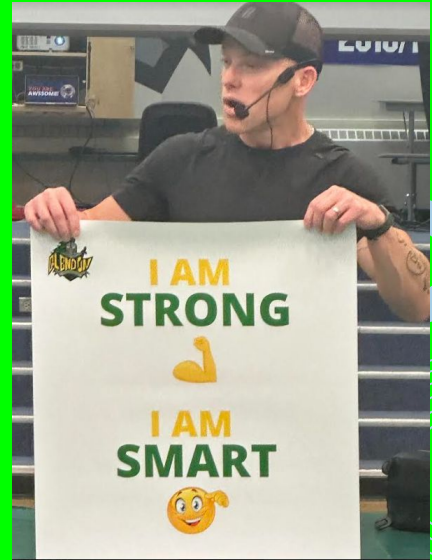
Guest Presenter Jon Hansen

Our staff is completing a PD next Tuesday to use the lesson plan resources.

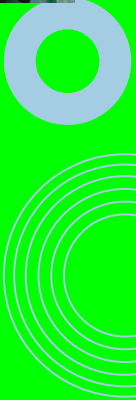
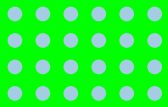
Focused on the following messages for students:

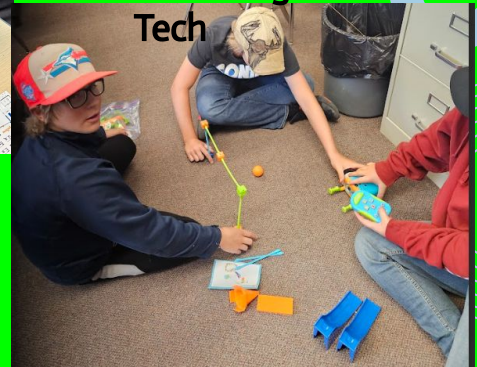

Getting Ready for Exploration Days

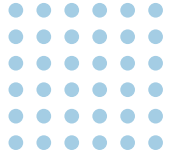

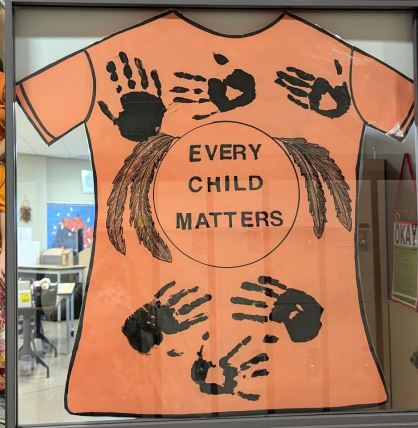

In grade 10 we have 71 of 113 identifying as Indigenous = 63%

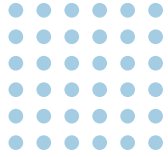
In grade 9 we have 88 of 123 identifying as Indigenous = 72%

We welcomed lots of NEW and returning students to LTA School for the 24/25 school year.

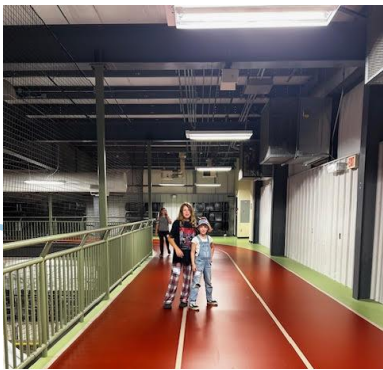
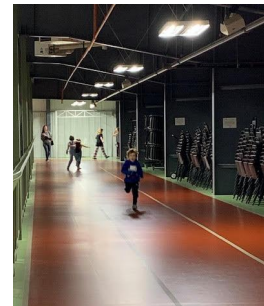
