Dear Parents,

On Wednesday October 16th, we will be building either a small boat or bridge using different kinds of materials. I am asking that you send some materials to school that your child can use to build their boat or bridge. You do not need to build anything at home; just bring in materials to build with.

Materials might include: -Paper -Cardboard -Fabric -Aluminum Foil -Playdough -Popsicle sticks -Toothpicks -Straws -Plasticine -Plastic bottle caps -Bottles -Foam -Egg carton -Lego -Cork -Toilet Paper Rolls -String -Tape -Glue




Don't feel you need to go out and buy any materials; use what you have around the house already.




