







In our PE classes, Mr. Webb taught the students Inuit games, focusing on agility and strength.

Metis Crossing-Land Based Learning









Our visit to Métis Crossing was an unforgettable experience filled with learning, creativity, and connection. During our *Meet the Métis* program, we explored the history and traditions of the Métis people, learning about the buffalo, Louis Riel, and Métis culture. Walking through traditional homes gave us a glimpse into the past, while hands-on activities like dot art, fish scale art, and sewing with the blanket stitch allowed us to engage with Métis artistry in a meaningful way.

Through the *Tales from the Trapline* tour, we learned how the Métis people relied on the land for survival, gathering materials to build fires and shelters. We were taught the importance of respecting nature—taking only what we need and always giving back. We even practiced fire-making, shelter-building, and different trapping techniques, gaining a deeper understanding of traditional Métis skills and ways of life.

One of the most magical moments of our trip was *Whispers to the Stars*, where Elder Lilly Rose shared stories about the stars and the origins of the Métis people. Gathered around the fireplace in our pajamas, we listened intently to her words, feeling the warmth of both the fire and the rich cultural stories being passed down.

This field trip was a beautiful way to immerse ourselves in Métis heritage, and we left with new knowledge, cherished memories, and a deep appreciation for the traditions shared with us.
